



APPRENTICE TRAINING PROGRAM FACT SHEET

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The Apprentice Training Program is designed to train select and spiritually mature persons through 30 hours of education and mentoring, which includes the apprentice completing 12 full spiritual direction sessions with a directee.

Only a limited number of apprentices can be accepted at any one time and the program takes between 6-9 months to complete, so a wait list or delayed start is possible.

The mission of the program is intensive training in the *basics* of spiritual guidance, with an emphasis on Practicum (the doing of actual sessions with a directee) and Supervision. For this 2nd half of the program, we will use at least 3 video recorded apprentice-led spiritual direction sessions for practicum discussion and at least 9 sessions with no recording but write-ups as supervision case studies for traditional Supervision with the trainer. (For transparency and confidentiality purposes, the apprentices' directees must agree to having the session recorded or written up. A release form will indicate their session material will be used only for teaching and will be destroyed upon completion of the program).

Part of the appeal of the Apprentice program is its flexibility. Apprentices may request additional subject matter be covered. If they want more hours, they may also suggest any self-study aspects of the curriculum.

ABOUT US – The program was created in 2019 by Rev. Teresa Blythe, former director of the Hesychia School of Spiritual Direction. In 2021, the program expanded to include a second mentor/trainer, the Rev. Canon Greg Foraker. In 2022, it expanded again to include a third trainer, the Rev. Dr. Kelly Murphy Mason. All are master teachers of spiritual guidance. Bio information on Teresa, Greg, and Kelly is included with this fact sheet.

PHILOSOPHY - It is important to note that this program is laser focused on the non-directive or evocative method of spiritual direction. We believe this method is the safest for both director and directee. Using the evocative method, directors meet clients exactly where they are on their spiritual path, listen deeply and hold no agenda or offer no “fixes” or advice to the directee. The method and tools taught come primarily from a contemplative Christian background, but because of its non-directive nature, this method works well with people from a variety of spiritual backgrounds.

We do not require that apprentices be from a particular religion or tradition, however we do look for people who have a regular spiritual practice, appreciate the inner life, and have taken a number of classes about the spiritual life.

Apprentices must have been in spiritual direction for a significant amount of time in their life, and it is a requirement that they have a spiritual director for the duration of the program. If you are in between directors or want to take this first step, we recommend SDI Companions website (www.sdicompanions.org) for a list of spiritual directors all over the world!

REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATE - Minimum of 30 hours with a trainer in 20 Modules (each running 1.5 hours).

LOCATION - Meetings are online via Zoom. The apprentice and trainer determine the days, time and frequency of sessions.

PRICING - The program’s price is based on a \$100 per hour rate. Total for individual sessions is \$3000, which may be paid in total or you may set up a payment plan with your trainer.

All payments go directly to the mentor/trainer you have chosen. We ask that as soon as you have been accepted and decide you want to be part of the program that you pay that \$300 deposit to your mentor/trainer which will count toward your first payment. Payments are made to your *trainer* via [Venmo](#), [Zelle](#) or in some cases a check may be mailed.

PROCEDURE FOR GETTING ON THE LIST FOR NEXT AVAILABLE OPENING

(Use this as a checklist)

- Step One: If you have questions about the program that this Fact Sheet does not answer, email Teresa Blythe at teresa@teresablythe.net
- Step Two: If you want to apply, download the application and recommendation forms online at <https://teresablythe.net/become-a-spiritual-director/> Please note that filing an application and recommendation does not automatically enroll you in the program. There are a few more steps.
- Step Three: You may choose which of the three mentors/trainers you want to work with (see bios). One may have more openings than another so if you want “first available,” let us know. If you choose “first available,” you are more likely to be able to start right away. Make a phone or Zoom appointment with Teresa, Greg or Kelly to talk about the program and see if it is a good fit for you and the mentor/trainer. They will let you know if you are accepted into the program.
- Step Four: Once accepted, if you want to commit to being an apprentice, you must pay a **\$300 deposit** to the mentor/trainer you have chosen. that will be counted toward your first installment or the total (if you pay in one payment). Venmo Greg @Greg-Foraker and Venmo Kelly at @Kelly-Mason-15. *This deposit gets you on the list for the next available opening (or you may defer beyond that date.) We currently have NO significant wait time if you choose first available trainer.*
- Step Five: Prior to your start date, you will be officially enrolled so you can get on our Thinkific learning platform and begin receiving our newsletter.
- Step Six: Begin on your appointed start date!
